First Ever AAU Basketball Movie Embarks on National Tour

New York – (October 2018) Amidst the controversy of payola and fringe benefits in the world of amateur basketball at the high school and college levels, the new movie *Warrior Pride* presents a behind-the-scenes look at what it takes to run a travel basketball team.

After a hugely successful kick-off premiere in Detroit, Black-Smith Enterprises officially announced that it would launch a national tour for the movie beginning on November 10th at the Downtown Independent in Los Angeles, CA, followed by stops in New York and Pittsburgh.
